### Welcome Back!

Welcome back to the new school year, I hope you all had a fantastic summer. Your children (or *you*!!) must have really missed school as we had 100% attendance on the first day back!

We all look forward to working with you again this school year.

### Flexi-Play!

As you will recall, one of the reasons we put forward for suggesting a 3.10pm finish in our consultation last school year was that we as a staff did not feel the "rigid" afternoon break of 2.10pm was always conducive to the best learning experiences we could give the children in the afternoon period.

As you know, the 3.10pm finish was not wanted by many of you and therefore we did not push ahead with this.

- However the afternoon issue remains and still needs to be dealt with!
- Therefore, this term, we are going to pilot a flexible approach to the afternoon break.
- Children will still get a break in the afternoon but it will not be set as a whole school time of 2.10pm 2.30pm. Each teacher will take an afternoon break with their class when it is a natural break in the work the children are doing that afternoon.
- Therefore, for example, if Class 4 were doing a project which Miss Priestley felt needed to run from the start of the afternoon session (1.15pm) until 2.45pm the children could complete this before than having a break.
- This is much harder for the teachers as they will therefore be "on duty" every afternoon (instead of being able to share duty times like in the past). However all teachers were absolutely convinced that this will improve the learning experiences of children and the teaching that they are able to do.
- The breaks will be of varying length depending on the time of afternoon they are taken and the needs of the children.
- There WILL be an **outside break** (weather permitting) **EVERYDAY** for children in Class 2 at some point in the afternoon. For children in Classes 3 and 4 there will *usually* be an outside afternoon break at some point each afternoon but it might be that on some occasions if the children are really fired up with a project that they just take a quick indoor break at times or perhaps even on some occasions work straight through (although this will be very much the exception and not the rule!)
- Our Nursery and Reception children's outdoor afternoon 'playtimes' will be met through continuous provision in the outdoor area in the afternoon anyway so they will also not have "set" playtimes in the afternoon.
- All classes will continue to have the same shared morning and lunchtime breaks
- As stated, this is something we are going to try until Christmas and then evaluate the success of it.
- As always we would appreciate any feedback you have or you get from your children once the system has had a chance to run for a while.
- It is very early days yet but one Class 4 pupil said to Miss Priestley yesterday "This flexi-play is the best thing ever!" So far so good then!
